On behalf of my Government, it is an honor and a big pleasure to be here today celebrating this very special *United Nations Day for South-South Cooperation.*

At the outset, let me thank the office of the United Nations for South-South Cooperation, the Government of Argentina and other partners, for organizing this significant event to commemorate the 41 years of the adoption of the Buenos Aires Plan of Action for Promoting and Implementing Technical Cooperation among Developing Countries (well known as BAPA), a key action frame for this kind of cooperation. Thus, in the *Outcome Document*, countries renewed their commitment to promote South-South Cooperation and established a series of actions to strengthen and achieve the Sustainable Development Goals. In this regard, I would like to reiterate that for Colombia it is a priority that we advance in the *measurement of South-South Cooperation*, to value knowledge and its transfer beyond their direct and indirect costs.

I take also this opportunity to highlight and thank the work of the **United Nations Office for South-South Cooperation**, in its capacity of knowledge center of South-South and Triangular Cooperation. Likewise, to renew our country's commitment to continue participating actively in the Bureau of the High Level Committee on South-South Cooperation.

Finally, Colombia would like to encourage Member States, United Nations entities, the private sector and all other relevant stakeholders of the United Nations system, to advance in the implementation of the actions agreed in the **Outcome Document** of **BAPA + 40**, and reiterates its willingness to promote initiatives that strengthen South-South and Triangular Cooperation.
